The business activities of AsureQuality are divided into two main operating groups - Operations, and Laboratories and Diagnostics.

interest in Saudi Arabia:

AsureQuality is in the process of establishing a food testing laboratory in Jeddah with their joint venture partners, the Saudi testing company Motabagah. The final paperwork for the joint venture is expected to be finalised in the fourth quarter 2016. The joint venture will eventually involve three laboratories based in the Saudi cities of Jeddah, Riyadh and Dammam, which will be developed to deliver food testing, training and audit service for all GCC countries.

12. Sequal Lumber (http://www.sequallumber.co.nz/

Sequal Lumber (SQL) is a unique sawmill that was established in 2006 and is designed to produce and supply timber that is cut to order. That means that rather than cut up a log into planks simply to maximise recovery, SQL cuts up a log to maximise value based on pre-ordered dimensions. The customer base are furniture manufacturers (in China and Vietnam) for the kiin dried outer wood and construction and packaging manufacturers for the lower quality green inner wood (Korea, Japan and the Middle East). SQLs kilns are powered by geothermal energy.

Interest in Saudi Arabia:

Sequal Lumber sells sawn lumber for the packaging industry in Saudi Arabia, mainly for the transportation plastics and petrochemical products. Saudi Arabia is an Important market for the company with one Saudi customer alone purchasing 15% of the lumber Sequal produces. With NZTE's assistance Sequal is also now looking to diversity its Saudi customer base into the cable drum market.
